School Life Group terms of reference

1. Background

Broadhempston Village Primary School is part of The Link Academy Trust. The school's Governing body is the Totnes Local Board. In addition to the Local Board, the school has formed a School Life Group to promote partnership between the school, pupils, and parents. The School Life Group will be the forum for sharing, discussing, and supporting the developments in school. It also provides an opportunity for parent views to be represented and discussed. The School Life Group will complement the PTFA and the Local Board.

2. Purpose of the School Life Group

The School Life Group will:

- support the Academy Head to help achieve the School's Vision and Values and British values (Appendix 1)
- provide a forum for sharing and discussion on matters relevant to the school offer and experience for the children.
- through minutes & via Governor Rep, communicate with the Totnes Local Board, PTFA, parents and the local community.
- strengthen and develop engagement with the community and parents.

The School Life Group <u>will not</u> discuss the following matters:

- School policies and procedures relating to general curriculum issues & details.
- Issues relating to individual children or staff.
- Individual complaints or grievances.

These issues should be referred directly by individual parents to the class teacher in the first instance or the Exec Academy Head.

A member of the School Life Group may be re-elected and re-appointed after their term by election.

Membership may vary according to the structure of classes in school, but members already voted on will remain in place until the end of their period of membership.

If a member acts in a way that is considered by other members to undermine the objectives of the group, their membership shall be terminated if the majority of parent members agree. Termination of membership would be confirmed in writing to the member by the Chair.

4. Meetings of the committee

- The School Life Group will meet at least once a term (4 times a year), September, December, March & July
- The meeting will be chaired by the Local Governing Board representative.
- Minutes of the meetings will be made available on the school website (and be notified via the school app) but the meetings will not be open to the public.
- The Chair of the committee will take minutes and circulate to the group for agreement.
- A standing agenda and report from the Head will be circulated ahead of each meeting by the Chair to allow parent rep to read and ask questions at the meeting. Parents reps should also seek any issues parents of their class would like raised for discussion at the meeting.
- Class Parent Representatives are expected to cascade information to their classes and invite feedback/ideas and suggestions in advance of the meeting. Reps are expected to attend each meeting or send their questions and any discussion topics to the Chair ahead of the meeting.
- Reps are encouraged to fully participate in discussions and positively represent the views of their classes. Each rep will have the opportunity to raise matters pertaining to their classes under "Parent Rep Feedback" so long as it falls within the scope of the School Life Group.
- Meetings will be held after school in the village hall and last approximately 1 hour. Meetings will be calendared for the year ahead at the start of the academic year.
- The impact of its work and Terms of Reference will be reviewed annually at the end of each academic year, initiated by the Chair

During the meetings:

We will:


- Respect confidentiality and never name individual teachers, pupils, members of staff or other parents.




