## **BROADHEMPSTON LEARNERS**

What a busy start we have had in **Birch Class**. Reception have been getting used to the routine of school and have been making new friends, they have all settled brilliantly into school, well done Reception.



In English, year 1 and 2 have been learning the story

'The Train Ride' they have made story maps and put actions to the story to help them learn it, why don't you ask them to tell you the story? This week we are changing the story as a class, instead of a train it will be a different vehicle, I wonder what they will come up with!

All of Birch class are enjoying the new history unit, which is all about toys of the past, we started the unit off with the children brining in their favourite toys and sharing them with the class. Year 1 and 2 were amazed at how things have changed since the 1960s!



**Sycamore** class have been having fun building circuits in science, experimenting with insulators and conductors and making predictions about the outcome of their findings. They have been using batteries, lightbulbs, and wires to build the original circuits and swapping in a range of materials such as paper clips and pencils. Great teamwork and problem-solving Sycamore!



#### **Oak Class**

Oak Class had a great day out in Lyme Regis linked to their evolution and inheritance science topic. There were met by an expert scientist and fossil hunter who took them on a tour of the museum which was built on the site of Mary Anning's former home. He spoke about the geology of the Jurassic Coast and the significance of Mary Anning, and her discoveries and they then followed in her footsteps and took to the beach for their own fossil hunt.
