
Forest School would not have been complete without a fire and marshmallow toasting which everyone found very yummy, a great day was had by the whole class.

In Design and Technology, Sycamore class have been honing their circuit building skills to create switches out of cardboard, paper clips and split pins. This is for their torch making project, which will be completed next week as the housing and insulating materials are added. Thank you for remembering to supply your child with an old plastic bottle, it is much appreciated. This project has allowed another opportunity for our class to shine, as they work together productively, finding solutions to the problems they encounter. In Science, we have been experimenting with the power of toothpaste on our enamel. The children have tested a variety





of liquids on eggs to investigate the impact of toothpaste in terms of staining, plaque building and erosion. It was wonderful to see their faces as the vinegar left the egg without a shell.



We had a very special assembly with Cultural Champion Souad who explained what it was like as a Muslim living in Britain. **Oak Class** then had a follow up session where they learnt about the pillars of Islam and were able to ask their own questions to deepen their understanding of her faith.
