STAFFING UPDATES

- Mrs. Jodie Talbot has joined our team, teaching Sycamore for the second part of the week.
- Rosina Kellman has joined us to be the SENDCo for our school. She will be here on a Tuesday each week. She is highly experienced and works for 3 Trust schools in the same role.

Class organisation

I am pleased to note that our school is very popular, and our School Ambassadors are kept busy showing potential new families what we have to offer. Our aim is to ensure we make our big-hearted school a place to discover and desire! We are a school who aims to be full with 70 pupils. Our PAN - planned admission number (agreed at county level) is 10 for reception children each year. This means we have a maximum of 30 in Birch class. This meets the statutory requirement for class sizes in EYFS & KS1 to be a maximum of 30 pupils. You might be interested to know that suggested staff to pupil ratios in KS1 is 1 adult to 30 children. In KS2 (Sycamore and Oak) we can have more than 10 children in a year group, but our size would limit our capacity to go much over PAN.

We are incredibly lucky to have amazing staff, great staff to pupil ratios, and fab amenities on our doorstep. Long may this continue!

Broadhempston is not its own admission authority. Devon County lead all admissions and will at times direct us to accept pupils if it falls within our PAN or just above at KS2. The Trust also has an admissions committee that I must contact once Devon County has contacted school. The Trust will discuss pupil numbers and advise what I am to do regarding county requests. The bottom line is that there is a process, and we are bound by the rules.

Again, there is a process to be followed and we are bound by rules and criteria. This would not be led at a school level but at a Trust level.

- Jill completed a safeguarding summary report for Trustees at the beginning of January reporting on the autumn term
- Jill has completed Fire warden training & medication awareness training. I have also completed Early help Training - Early Help is the extra support a family can get if they need it. It may be that we want to prevent a problem or change things for a family before the problem becomes more serious. It is not a specific service or team, it's an approach that brings together people from a range of services and teams who will work together with the whole family to help improve the situation for everyone. It can offer support to families from pre-birth to adolescents with all sorts of issues from parenting, employment and school attendance to emotional wellbeing or anti-social behaviour.
